POLICY:

Within 90 calendar days, the Early Childhood Program will obtain determinations from health care and oral health care professionals as to whether or not the child is up-to-date on a schedule of age appropriate preventive and primary medical and oral health care.

PROCEDURE:

Program staff will work with families to obtain documentation or assist with making arrangements to ensure the following health requirements are met within the 90 day timeframe.

Required health documentation:

Physical Examination: Annual exam performed by a physician or a KanBeHealthy examination from the local Health Dept, before entry into the classroom.

Lead Screening: The screening will be required at entry to preschool. If the child attends a second year, a verbal lead screening is acceptable and will be considered negative if the entry screening was below 9mcg/dl and the family has not moved since the entry screening. A repeat lead screening will be required if these areas have not been met.

Hemoglobin: Hemoglobin screening is required upon entry and can be completed at the time of the physical examination. The exception will be if a physician orders a refusal for the screening.

Dental Examinations: A dental visual exam is required within the first 90 days, annually.
